Dear Resident/Occupier,

Advance warning of works to carry out Underground Utilities/Services Investigations

London Borough of Sutton has secured 'Major Scheme' funding from Transport for London (TfL), to carry out improvements in the Beddington Lane area. The Beddington Major Scheme is currently in its first of three years. The first year is for investigation and development of proposals.

As part of the initial investigations the council will be carrying out a number of underground surveys along Beddington Lane to obtain information to assess the best way to progress proposals for improvements in the area.

This particular survey work will start on Monday 10th October 2016. To minimise disruption the surveys will take place at night between 21:00 & 04:00, Monday - Thursday.

These particular works will be to trace out & map all of the Statutory Undertakers plant (e.g. gas, water, electricity etc.) through all of the Gateway Areas within Beddington Lane that have been identified to be included in the Major Scheme. The process is non-invasive (it will involve techniques such as ground penetrating radar), so it will not involve digging holes in the carriageway.

Where the process does not involve excavation, it will not be noisy but we expect that there will be some disruption & inconvenience. As a result in residential areas the survey work will only be carried out between 21:00-00:00 (or as close as possible to 00:00).


It is anticipated that the work will take between 10-12 nights with temporary traffic management in use to ensure the safety of the public and workforce.

The Beddington TfL Major Scheme aims to make improvements to the quality of transport options and accessibility in the area, including walking, cycling and public transport, as well as addressing highways-related issues. It will also improve the quality of the local environment. The council will engage with residents and businesses in the development of the proposals.
